



Aging Societies: Are There Solutions?

April 18, 2000, New York, NY - The UN Population Division issued a report on replacement migration projecting that over the next 50 years the populations of virtually all countries in Europe as well as Japan will face population decline and population aging. As these populations decline, there are questions around how societies will cope with an older society that needs support and institutions and infrastructure that were created for a younger and larger population. The report analyzes international migration that a country would need to offset population decline in areas such as the workforce to support those over 65.
