Nearly 30 international health providers and practitioners participated in the Gates Institute's Reproductive Health and Development Summer Training in late June of 2005. Population Resource Center hosted a luncheon, and in conjunction with the Institute, provided the international visitors a chance to share knowledge and exchange process techniques with policymakers from the United States. Representative Danny K. Davis reviewed access to health care during his career as a health administrator and a Member of Congress. He shared his thoughts on international health, its place in U.S. policy, and spoke on the importance of demographic data and the way it connects to the work of practitioners and health providers on the ground.
